THE LONG FAREWELL Dolgie provody	Kira Muratova USSR (Ukraine) 1971 HD PG coarse language & sexual references A rift grows between an impulsive single mother and her increasingly resentful teenage son, who wants to live with his father. Another long-banned major early work from the Ukrainian auteur. "A film of tenderness and sorrow and a tribute to unconventional, independent women" – Jason Sanders, PFA

FRENCH CONNECTIONS

INDIA SONG Marguerite Duras | France | 1975 | HD | PG
A haunted-house movie unlike any other, this most celebrated work from Marguerite Duras is an almost incantatory experience with few stylistic precedents. "One of the most beautiful films in the history of cinema" – *Criterion*

THE LONG ABSENCE Henri Colpi | France/Italy | 1961 | HD | G
Scripted by Marguerite Duras and directed by Henri Colpi, a regular editor for Alain Resnais and Agnes Varda, this forgotten New Wave film won the Palme d'Or in 1961. "Encompasses a world of feeling" – *NYT*

WE NOUS Alice Diop | France | 2021 | HD | Exempt
A sensitive documentary portrait of the disparate communities that lie along the Paris urban commuter rail line from the director of *Saint Omer*. "Great observational intelligence and sympathy" – *Guardian*

UNDER THE FIG TREES Erige Sehiri | Tunisia/Switzerland/France/Qatar/Germany | 2021 | HD | PG violence & coarse language
This debut feature from Erige Sehiri chronicles and animates the lives of a group of Tunisian women fig harvesters, in an understated and intimate story of sisterhood. "A sun-dappled gem" – *Variety*

CASABLANCA BEATS Nabil Ayouch | France/Morocco | 2021 | HD | M
offensive language & domestic abuse themes
A rapper-turned-teacher helps his students find their creative voice in this grittily empowering hip-hop fable. "Irresistibly youthful" – Jessica Kiang

ASHKAL Youssef Chebbi | France/Tunisia/Qatar | 2022 | HD

CAIRO CONSPIRACY Tarik Saleh | Sweden/France/Finland/Denmark | 2022 | HD | M violence
This firebrand thriller set in Cairo's Al-Azhar University, the country's most respected religious teaching institution, deftly explores the tangled state of modern-day Egypt. "A world no one has dared to explore on film before" – *Variety*

FIRST COW Kelly Reichardt | USA | 2019 | HD | PG violence & coarse language

HIT THE ROAD Panah Panahi | Iran | 2021 | HD | M offensive language

SHIVA BABY Emma Seligman | USA | 2020 | HD | M sex scenes & offensive language
Dizzying and captivating, Emma Seligman's debut feature stars Rachel Sennott as a young woman at a family wake who cannot escape her sugar daddy, her ex-girlfriend or her own lies. "Gets funnier with every new complication" – *AV Club*

COW Andrea Arnold | United Kingdom | 2021 | HD | Exempt
The acclaimed director of *Red Road* and *American Honey* shifts to documentary to create an immersive, highly empathetic yet completely unflinching portrait of one dairy cow's life. "A vital and ground-breaking work of art" – *The Wrap*

WE WERE ONCE KIDS Eddie Martin | Australia | 2021 | HD | R16 drug use, suicide, sex scenes & offensive language

AN ANGEL AT MY TABLE Jane Campion | New Zealand/Australia | 1990 | HD
PG coarse language
New Zealand's most distinguished filmmaker tells the story of our most renowned novelist, Janet Frame, from poverty-stricken childhood to misdiagnosed schizophrenia to literary fame. "Imbued with gentle humor and great compassion" – *New York Times*

RAIN Christine Jeffs | New Zealand | 2001 | HD | M
Based on a novel by Kirsty Gunn, this is an evocative mood piece about the disintegration of a marriage. As a mother seeks escape, her daughter grows up too fast. "Wide implications and stunning impact... an important feature debut" – *Los Angeles Times*

CULT CLASSICS

THE UNKNOWN Tod Browning | USA | 1927 | HD | PG
Lon Chaney delivers a wrenchingly physical performance as an armless knife-thrower whose infatuation with his beautiful assistant (18-year-old Joan Crawford) drives him to unspeakable extremes. "Races along with the awful momentum of a bad dream" – *Chicago Reader*

FREAKS Tod Browning | USA | 1932 | HD | R16
Probably the most transgressive film produced in 1930s Hollywood, Tod Browning's cult classic remains an extraordinary experience with its cast of real-life sideshow performers. "A wild ride... macabre and disturbing" – *Los Angeles Times*

POSSESSION Andrzej Zulawski | France/West Germany | 1981 | HD | R18 sex scenes
Polish maverick Andrzej Zulawski's feverish cult favourite stars a mesmerisingly unhinged Isabella Adjani. A young Sam Neill plays her husband – a spy in Cold War Berlin. "Entirely singular. Essential viewing" – *Time Out*

MISHIMA: A LIFE IN FOUR CHAPTERS Paul Schrader | Japan/USA | 1985 | HD | M nudity, sexual references, suicide theme & content that may disturb
Propelled by an unforgettable score by Philip Glass, this is a visually stunning, collage-like portrait of acclaimed and problematic Japanese author and playwright Yukio Mishima. "One of the most gorgeous and sophisticated portraits of an artist ever put on film" – *New Yorker*

KIDS Larry Clark | USA | 1995 | HD | R18 drug use, suicide, sex scenes & offensive language
Scripted by a teenaged Harmony Korine, this grungy, doco-style drama on the lives of a group of sex-obsessed, drug-abusing NY teenagers provoked scandal and big box office on release. "Honest, relentless, and brilliant" – *New York Magazine*
